Having served over 8,000 different teens since 2010, we are a statistical success; however, we firmly believe that our true success lies in the individual stories of the students we serve. We are excited to share two stories about how Bridge programs provided students with direction for their futures.

The first came from a Mom who shared, "My daughter asked me to go to Trader Joe's for ingredients that she has used during a culinary program....while there, she was approached by an employee that praised The Bridge. Then we went to Chuy's for lunch and my daughter then was conversing with the people there that she knew through The Bridge. THANK YOU for making my daughters' life dream of becoming a chef even more attainable!"

The second revolves around a completely different career path, thanks to our friends at Colonial Chapel in Orland Park and a volunteer teacher from Tinley Park High School. "My daughter wants to become a mortician....last year she was able to visit, tour, and speak to the director at a funeral home. This year, she was also able to dissect a fetal pig during a program at The Bridge. The Bridge offers incredible opportunities."

We consider it a privilege to provide more than 350 different opportunities like this each year that help provide our students with hope, purpose and direction in their lives.
